# NORTHEAST OVERVIEW



The North-eastern Region (NER), which includes the eight States of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, and Tripura, is the easternmost region of India. Since each state has a border with at least one of the five nations to the east of the country, this area serves as a gateway to Southeast Asia and is of great strategic importance.

*Furthermore, the NER is widely recognized as one of the most diverse regions in Asia, characterized by a rich tapestry of ethnicities and languages. Each state within NER boasts a unique blend of distinct cultures and traditions.*

The Northeast region of India is a well-known biodiversity hotspot that is also home to a rich mix of cultures. In addition, the region is blessed with abundant natural resources that are yet to be fully explored and exploited. The region also holds a significant stake in the country's 'Act East Policy,' which is aimed at promoting economic, political, and cultural ties with Southeast Asia. With a wealth of natural resources, human resources, and potential for agriculture and horticulture, the region is rapidly emerging as a hub for sustainable manufacturing and service industries. Additionally, the region's rich ethnic, religious, linguistic, and cultural diversity makes it a highly attractive destination for tourists, offering significant potential for growth and development in the tourism sector.

With an area of 2.6 lakh sq. km, the NER accounts for about 7.98 per cent of the total geographical area of India while being home to 3.78 per cent of India's total population. The region is characterised by a mixed topography of hills and plains, with hills occupying 70 per cent of the land area. With a significant tribal population accounting for around 54 percent of its total population, especially in the hilly areas, the Northeast region of India is unique in its diversity. The region is home to approximately 135 Scheduled Tribe groups out of a total of approximately 705 across India

With plentiful natural resources, agro-horticultural and forest resources, hydroelectric potential, oil and natural gas and mineral deposits, the northeast region is well poised for investment and economic growth.



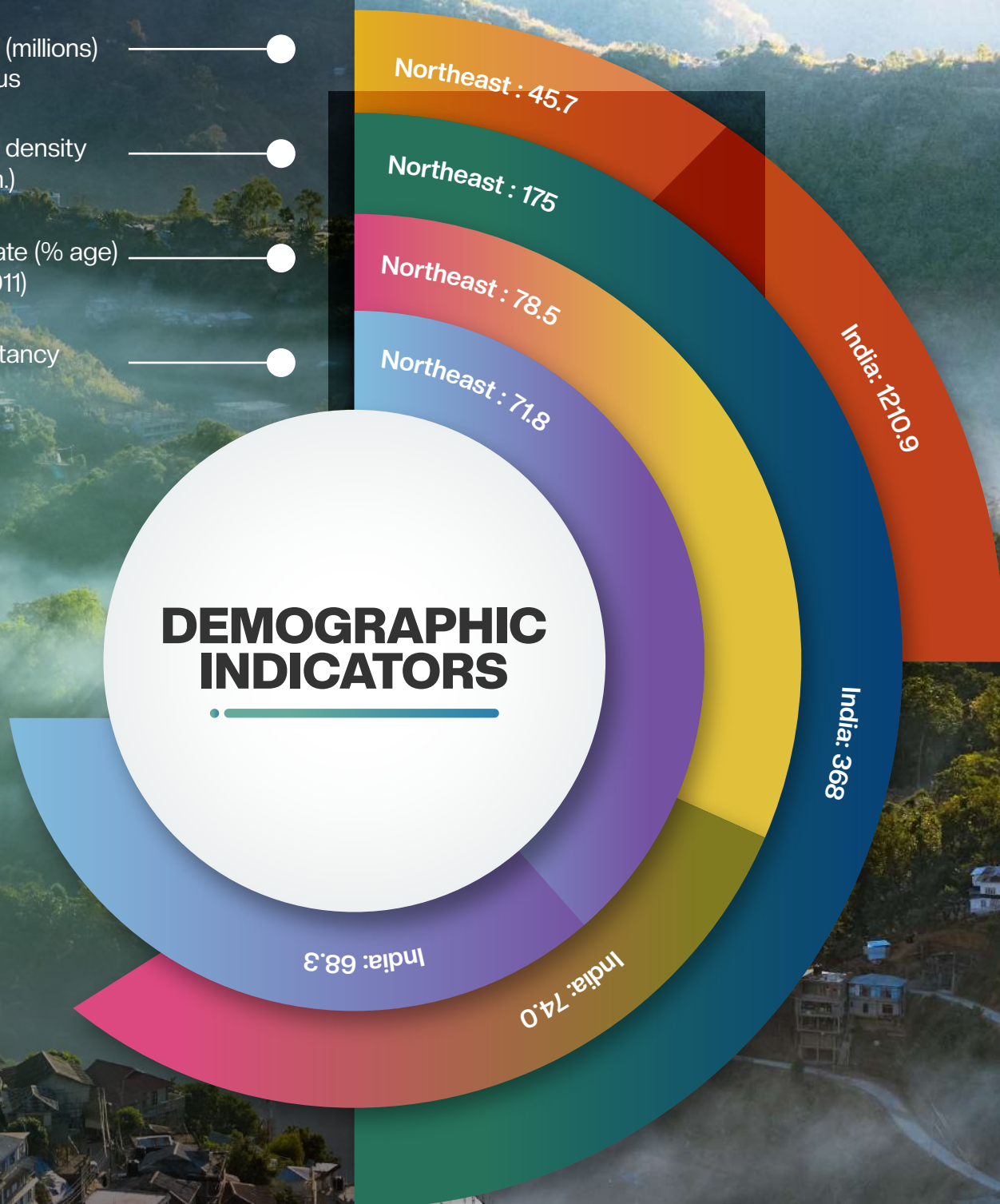

# Connectivity in NER

## **Accessibility**

The region has a good network of road, rail and air connectivity which provides seamless access to each corner of the region.

## **Road Connectivity**

The region has provided round the year connectivity to all the industrial areas. To reduce the travel time between major cities and industrial areas within the 8 states, various four lane Highways are being constructed across the region.

## **Air Connectivity**

The region has 17 operational airports situated across the 8 states. Also, helicopter is the fastest way to commute within the States, it has a few helipads with Heli Taxi service between main state capitals.

## **Rail Connectivity**

The region has also connected with rail connectivity. To reduce the travel time between major cities and industrial areas within the 8 states, various rail tracks are being constructed across the region.





# Healthcare Sector in India

The healthcare sector in India offers investment opportunities in hospitals, medical equipment, clinical trials, telemedicine, out sourcing, medical tourism, health insurance, medical devices and pharmaceutical manufacturing. Healthcare has become one of the largest sectors of the Indian economy, in terms of both revenue and employment. It has been growing at a CAGR of 22% since 2016, employing 4.7 Million people directly. Several factors are driving the growth of the Indian healthcare sector including increased life expectancy, a growing middle class, the rising proportion of lifestyle diseases, an increased emphasis on public-private partnerships as well as accelerated adoption of digital technologies, including telemedicine, besides heightened interest from investors and increased FDI inflows over the last two decades.

- The Indian healthcare sector is expected to record a three-fold rise, growing at a CAGR of 22% between 2016–22 to reach US\$ 372 billion in 2022-23 from US\$ 110 billion in 2016.
- India's public expenditure on healthcare stood at 5.85 Lakh Crore in BE 2023-24 against 2.43 Lakh Crore in 2017-18.
- In FY 22-23, premiums underwritten by health insurance companies grew to Rs. 89,491.76 crore, indicating growth of 22.51% over previous year.
- The Indian medical tourism market was valued at US\$ 2.89 billion in 2020 and is expected to reach US\$ 13.42 billion by 2026. It is reported that close to 697,300 foreign tourists came for medical treatment in India in FY19.
- The e-health market size is estimated to reach US\$ 10.6 billion by 2025.

In 2023, the Government of India augmented the budgetary allocation for the life sciences and pharmaceutical sector to 2.1% of the country's GDP. This increase was reflected in the budgeted estimates, which rose from INR 77,351 crores in the revised estimate to INR 88,956 crores.

#### *The focus areas of Budget 2023 are*

- Cancer care centers in every district by FY 2026 and 200 new Daycare Cancer Centers by FY 2025-26 for localized chemotherapy and treatment.
- Simplification of visa procedures for medical tourists to boost India's medical tourism market that is valued at USD 7.56–USD 10.4 billion in 2024.
- Allocation of Rs 2,445 crore for the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme to boost pharmaceutical manufacturing.
- To enhance healthcare facilities and set up five skill centers to train 3,00,000 healthcare professionals annually to meet global healthcare demands.

#### *Customs exemption for specified products required for the sector were extended:*

- Current customs exemption for lifesaving drugs and specified drugs, medicines, diagnostic kits extended by two years up to 31 March 2025.
- Specified drugs and medicines supplied free of cost to patients under Patient Assistance Program, specified medical and surgical instruments, hospital equipment - extended by one year up to 31 March 2024.
- The Budget 2025-26 proposes to add 36 life saving drugs and medicines to the list of medicines fully exempted from Basic Customs Duty.
- The Budget 2025-26 also proposes to add 6 life saving medicines to the list attracting concessional customs duty of 5%.
- 37 more medicines and 13 new patient assistance programmes to be fully exempted from Basic Customs Duty (where they are supplied free of cost to patients).







# Healthcare Sector in NER

The healthcare sector is an integral part of any region's development, and North East India is no exception. The region has made significant strides in recent years to improve its healthcare facilities and services. With a population of over 45 million people, the need for quality healthcare services is growing.

**Access to Healthcare:** North East India has seen significant improvement in this area. Many new hospitals and clinics have been established, and telemedicine services have been introduced to remote areas. The government has also initiated schemes to ensure healthcare accessibility for all.

The National Health Mission (NHM) and Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) are two such schemes that have been introduced to improve access to healthcare services for the people of the region.

*Under the Assam Cancer Care Foundation (ACCF), a collaboration between the Assam Government and Tata Trusts for setting up 17 cancer care units in the state, of which six were inaugurated in 2022.*

# Ayush & Wellness

The North Eastern Institute of Ayurveda & Homoeopathy (NEIAH), Shillong, Meghalaya is an autonomous institute newly established under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. As part of the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) Scheme, a total of 1000 new Health & Wellness Centres (HWC), will be opened in the NE states for growth and development of AYUSH systems. The aim of these centres is to provide a holistic wellness model based on principles of AYUSH systems of medicine. To boost the popularity of traditional medicines provided by AYUSH, the minister announced setting up of 100 AYUSH dispensaries under NAM in the northeast region.

The Ministry of AYUSH has decided to upgrade the Government Ayurvedic College in Guwahati and develop it as a Centre of Excellence. Apart from this, a facilitation Centre for Semi Processing of raw material will be set up in NER. Regional Raw Drug Repository (RRDR) in NE states in collaboration with National Institute of Bio-Resources and Sustainable Development in Imphal, Manipur under Department of Bio-Technology. These initiatives will be undertaken under the Central Sector Scheme run by National Medicinal Plants Board, Ministry of AYUSH. The AYUSH medical facilities under North-Eastern State Governments, Central Government and teaching hospitals in AYUSH colleges will be brought under AYUSH Health Management Information System (AHMIS) to develop digital data base of AYUSH interventions in various disease management.

**Tibetan medicine** is a traditional system of medicine that has been practiced for over a thousand years in Tibet and the Himalayan regions of Nepal, Bhutan, and India. In recent years, Tibetan medicine has gained popularity in North East India, where there is a significant Tibetan community. Tibetan medicine utilizes a range of therapies including herbal medicine, acupuncture, moxibustion, cupping, and massage.







# Pharmaceuticals Manufacturing sector in NER

The pharmaceutical industry is one of the most rapidly growing industries in the world, and North East India is poised to be a significant player in this sector. With the region's abundance of natural resources, favourable government policies, and strategic location, investing in the pharma sector in North East India can yield great returns. - Sikkim has already scripted a success story in the pharmaceutical sector and Assam has attracted a number of pharmaceutical companies. The entire region has the potential to become a hub of pharmaceutical manufacturing. Investing in the pharma sector in North East India also has significant export potential. With its proximity to neighbouring countries such as Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar, and Bhutan, the region can easily export its products to these countries. *The telemedicine market is expected to be the highest potential eHealth segment in India, with a projected value of \$5.4 Bn by 2025 and a CAGR of 31%.*

However, in many remote areas of the North East region, there is a dearth of specialized trauma and critical care facilities. Investing in such facilities can address the increasing demand for specialized services, improve the quality of healthcare, and create job opportunities.

The region is blessed with abundant natural beauty and cultural diversity, making it an ideal destination for medical tourists seeking to combine healthcare services with travel and leisure. # Highlights of EODB in the States of NER



*Implementation of single window clearance portal in all the states of northeast for providing G2B services in a seamless timebound manner.*

- As a measure to create a conducive business eco system, the states of North East India have implemented one stop single window system for all G2B permits and permissions required for any business activity.
- Among many other features of the single window system, a notable functionality in the system is Centralised Inspection Module which helps in random allocation of inspection inspectors and joint site inspection thereby reducing the time, procedure, and cost of many G2B services.

*Integration with NSWS*

- The North Eastern states have onboarded or are in the process of onboarding their G2B services in the National Single Window Portal. This will enable investors to easily apply for business clearances for their invest region.

*Industrial Policy for attracting investment in the region*

- To attract investment in the NER, the states have proactively implemented Industrial Policies which offer state specific incentives.

*Preferential land allotment policy through creating of Industrial Land Banks*

- Each state in the north east has developed industrial land banks for ease of land allocation.
- Sector specific Industrial Zones like Plastic Park, Textile Parks and IT Parks have been developed in the region.

*Reducing Compliance Burden*

- NE States have undertaken an exercise to reduce compliance burden through a process of rationalisation and decriminalizing minor offences.

*A robust feedback and grievance redressal mechanism*

- The states have put in place robust feedback and grievance redressal mechanisms to further improve ease of doing business.
